Friendship leads to lasting partnership in support of Diakon Youth Services

Twelve years after a backyard conversation led to support for a fledgling automotive program, Faulkner Subaru of Harrisburg and Diakon Youth Services have forged a lasting partnership that has touched hundreds of young lives.

“We started sending engines and transmissions to their auto program at the Diakon Wilderness Center for the students to work on and learn the basics,” says Doug Jones, president, Faulkner Subaru Harrisburg. “Eventually, we offered to bring the kids who were interested to the dealership, where they could shadow a real technician. Once they got here, they realized this is a real job that, if they study hard, they can do.”

In addition to hiring several youths who’ve participated in the program, Faulkner Subaru’s support has grown over the last decade to include financial support for needed supplies, field trips and various programs, such as the Summer of Success, an 11-week summer program hosted by the Center Point Day Program.

“Without the contribution of Faulkner Subaru, students would not be able to have a great summer experience both in learning and recreation,” says Jeremias Garcia, assistant administrator, Diakon Youth Services. “Their contribution has reached family systems, bringing joy, love and healing.”

It is the quality of the programs that continues to ensure Faulkner Subaru’s assistance, according to Doug.

“They have awesome programs. We don’t just write checks. We volunteer. We help out,” he says. “I’ve known Jeremias for 12 years. He knows he can come to me. We’re here to support them.”

Jones underscored that sentiment recently when the dealership selected Diakon Youth Services to be featured in a Subaru of America commercial.

“Diakon gives the kids in their programs a chance to succeed,” he says. “You never know what would happen to them if they didn’t have a place like Diakon to go to. I love what they do.”



Meals on Wheels volunteer couple treats clients like family

Most Meals on Wheels volunteers deliver a friendly greeting along with a meal to clients along their assigned route. But that was never enough for Bob and Deb Umbenhauer.

The couple, who serve clients of the Tremont Senior Community Center in Tremont, Pennsylvania, often spend two or more hours delivering meals along their route.

“We talk to the people, find out how they are doing, ask them if they need something,” says Bob. “We’ve both lost our mothers, and some of them are like family to us. They are so appreciative of what we do.”

The Umbenhauers, who retired from the Pottsville Area School District, signed on as Meals on Wheels volunteers in 2015. It was the first formal volunteer effort for the active pair, who like to fill their free time with long-distance bike rides and camping trips.

“We started out pinch-hitting, and then they had a need in Tremont,” Bob explains. “We’ve been there ever since.”

As they complete their deliveries every Wednesday and Friday, Bob will go into one house, while Deb goes into another.

“I’m tall and will get something off a top shelf for someone who can’t reach it. A lot of these people are in walkers, using canes. They need help,” Bob says. “For the price of opening a cabinet, they are so appreciative.”

Deb admits their volunteer efforts help them as much as the clients they serve.

“There is a lady on our route that I look forward to seeing every time. We hug each other, and she sings a song,” she says. “It ends with a hug around the neck. ‘I love you,’ she says. I say, ‘I love you more.’”

Their willingness to go the extra mile has earned them the affection of their clients – something they willingly return.

“We’ve connected with a lot of people over the years. When they pass on, it hurts like losing a family member,” says Bob. “I’m not sure how some drivers just ring the bell and go. We can’t do that. We’re the welfare check making sure they’re okay. For us, it’s not just a job.”

Cultivating a generous community

The residents of Lutheran Home at Topton started a gardening community back in 2019. Since then, they have been growing fresh vegetables and tending to a thriving garden. Currently, there are 12 gardeners who work in the garden. They grow tomatoes, sweet potatoes, potatoes, lettuce, squash, peas, beans, broccoli, Swiss chard, celery, corn, beets, peppers, hot peppers, onions, cucumbers and, occasionally, some flowers.

Dick Miller, the coordinator of the community garden, says the garden brings personal fulfillment to everyone involved, which motivates them to plant and grow. He says, "The reason for gardening is the joy of getting our hands dirty and watching something come from it."

The garden is a perfect spot to relax. "Oh, I just love it!" Carole Fiori, the longest-term active gardener, said. "What can be better than putting seeds into the ground, and then watching them sprout and grow? To be there and see how nature works, how can you not believe?!"

Carole, who has now been gardening for 20 years, enjoys the therapeutic effect of the atmosphere. She walks out to the garden from her house and spends a lot of time weeding. There, Carole relishes being in the center of this miracle of growth. "Sometimes, when I get out there and see her sitting on her gardening stool, she seems to be meditating on the wonder of it all as she pulls a few weeds or picks some beans, and sometimes [she] just loves to pass time in that space," Dick said.

Working in the garden is also a social experience, where residents build friendships and share stories. As Dick tells it, "There is so much satisfaction from being able to give back, and the most exciting part is watching something grow together."

Growing food in a garden comes with challenges and unforgettable moments. "Sometimes, we have critters come along and food sometimes disappears, but like Carole says, we need to share!" Dick says.

According to Dick, the garden undergoes changes each year. The community always makes sure that new residents can take part in the gardening. "We send information across our campus about how much food we have donated, and more people get involved with what we're doing," he points out.



The residents of Lutheran Home at Topton (LHT) joined in a community garden and donate produce weekly to St. Paul's UCC, Trexlertown, which Jim LeGates, who coordinates the donating part of the group's activity, describes as "our mission to those in need." They deliver the produce each Tuesday morning in time for the food pantry's opening at 10 a.m. The LHT Community Garden has been active for many years and currently has 11 gardeners who share 30 35-foot rows that they individually plant, cultivate and harvest.



Benevolent Care Committee member is motivated to help the less fortunate

As a longtime member of the Knights of Columbus, Eric Edstrom sees his role as a member of the Benevolent Care Committee at Cumberland Crossings as a natural fit.

“It demonstrates true Christian values to support those who are less fortunate,” he said. “That is where our greatest motivation comes from.”

For more than six years, Eric has enjoyed reaching out to his neighbors at the Diakon continuing care retirement

community in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, to ensure the continued care of those residents who have depleted their financial resources through circumstances beyond their control with the support of the Benevolent Care Fund.

“That is what the fund is there for,” he explained. “It is all kept in confidence to protect the individual receiving the benefit.”

Every year around Easter and Christmas, committee members reach out to neighbors through door-to-door solicitations following a notice in the bulletin that announces the dates of the upcoming campaign. During their meetings, they share details about the fund, leaving behind a coffee cup or flower as a sign of their appreciation.

“I take pride in being able to call or ring a neighbor’s bell to say I’m here,” Eric said. “It has always been a very easy thing for me to meet people in my circle, either as neighbors or in the dining room.”

The committee had its strongest response to the campaign in 2019, when it raised more than \$41,000. But, since the start of the pandemic, donations have struggled to return to that point.

“Our activity greatly diminished [during the height of the pandemic],” Eric said. “People didn’t want strangers in their homes. It was difficult to communicate with a mask on your face.”

Eric and his fellow committee members are hoping that, despite the lingering effects of the pandemic, they will receive a warm welcome from their fellow residents as they look forward to the coming campaign.

“We try our best to inform people that, should they need benefit from the Benevolent Care Fund, they would be given proper consideration. We, who are fortunate enough to support the fund to whatever degree we can, should be thankful that we have that opportunity,” he said. “At the same time, we assure people that as long as the committee and the wherewithal of Diakon exist, they will never go without a place to live.”

Breaking Ground

Luther Crest residents and Diakon staff broke ground August 23, 2022, for a new development of senior living apartments, called Greenwood, on the Allentown campus.

With approximately 250 current residents, future residents and Luther Crest staff watching, a group of Diakon executives, the president of the Luther Crest resident association, the Luther Crest sales team and one of the first new residents of the Greenwood expansion tossed shovelfuls of dirt to symbolize the start of the project, construction on which will begin in a few weeks. The Rev. Fady Lous, chaplain at Luther Crest, offered the invocation and blessing for the ceremony, and The Rev. Nelson Quinones of the Lehigh Mission District offered the benediction. Following the ceremony, stations were set up throughout the commons and dining areas to showcase specialty food items prepared by the Luther Crest culinary staff.

“Luther Crest is truly the family you get to choose, and I’m so excited to watch our family grow,” shared Nicole Rohrbach, NHA, PCHA, executive director at Luther Crest, in her remarks at the ceremony.

The Continuing Care Retirement Community, located at 800 Hausman Road, is building 71 spacious independent living apartments, as well as renovating the dining and interior common areas. The community also offers skilled nursing, memory care and personal care services.

The new apartments will incorporate open floor plans ranging from 920 to 1,900 square feet of living space. The one- and two-bedroom options include high ceilings, large balconies and modern kitchens and bathrooms. The dining renovations and expansion will consist of traditional dining options, a teaching kitchen, exhibition area, bistro, bar/tavern and more.

“The Greenwood expansion as well as our other planned renovations to Luther Crest are an opportunity to make an already-great community even better,”

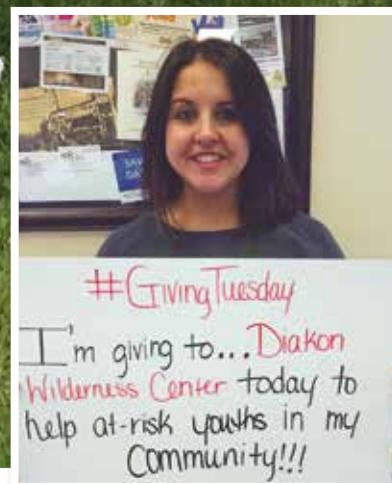
