Thanks to his efforts and the support of his probation officer, his fines have been paid off or waived with the help of our Second Chance Fund.

The second student's journey was equally impressive. He completed community service and demonstrated his dedication to his education. Again, with the help of our Second Chance Fund, his fines were dramatically decreased, which we then assisted with paying off.
