Building Confidence and Success at the Diakon Weekend Alternative Program

The Weekend Alternative Program (WAP) at the Diakon Wilderness Center in Boiling Springs provides an opportunity for young people to build confidence, develop leadership skills, and find new ways to overcome challenges in a supportive and empowering environment.

This program equips youth with the tools and support they need to thrive throughout 2025. We recognize that family support plays a crucial role in their success, which is why we're happy to have over 90% family engagement in treatment. This is measured by the percentage of families participating in at least one family based activity such as program orientation and goal setting, providing weekly treatment goal feedback in a youth's program goal book, or participating in transition meetings on a youth's final weekend.

With guidance from our dedicated staff, students leave the Weekend Alternative Program ready to tackle the rest of the year with renewed focus, set meaningful goals, and take the first steps toward lasting positive change this year and beyond.

have placed them at a crossroads.
This fund is used to match what the
youth has to pay toward court case
fees and fines, helping to alleviate
financial burdens while reinforcing
personal responsibility.
